Epistle: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 Gospel: Matthew 19:16-26

From the Saints & Teachers

1 COR 15:1 The Gospel in Which You Stand

The Message of the Gospel. St John Chrysostom: When St Paul calls the Corinthian Christians his brothers, he establishes the basis for most of his subsequent assertions. For we became brothers through the work of Christ in his earthly life and death. After all, what is the gospel but the message that God became man, was crucified and rose again? This is what the angel Gabriel announced to the Virgin Mary, what the prophets preached to the world and what all the apostles truthfully proclaimed. Homilies on the Epistles of St Paul to the Corinthians 38.2.

Matthew 19:16 Having Eternal Life

What Must I Do to Inherit Eternal Life? St John Chrysostom: And, behold, one came and said to him, "Good Master, what deed must I do to inherit eternal life?" Some criticize this young man as dissembling and wicked, approaching Jesus to put him to the test. I would not hesitate to say that he is avaricious and greedy since Christ also showed him up as such. Yet I would by no means call him a dissembler, because it is not safe to venture on things uncertain and especially in a case of blame. Such is also true because Mark has taken away the suspicion of dissembling. For Mark says, "A man ran up and kneeling before him asked him" and "Jesus looking upon him loved him." The tyranny of money is a powerful thing, as is clear here. Though we are practiced in the other virtues, avarice brings the others to ruin. **The Gospel of St Matthew, Homily 63.1.**
